A message from Father John

Working in team ministry: Do we always agree?

People ask me: "what is it like to work with a group of clergy?" The underlying question really has to do with the fact that clergy tend to be

very opinionated in their views. I can say that, for the most part, clergy are different. I believe that at the core of our belief is the life-giving reality of Jesus, and we are committed to following Him.

However, we are blessed at St. Paul's to have a group of clergy that have strongly-held and divergent opinions. We are not a group who always see eye to eye. I believe that we are able to value each other's views, while at the same time holding to our own convictions.

The impression I had in my youth was that people in the church thought alike. When I was ordained, I was surprised to find out how differently people thought about the important questions of faith. I became aware that, to my surprise, this diversity strengthened the faith community. Strongly-held views can add value to the life of the community and do not detract from its central Gospel.

During Lent, I am trying to put together a few evenings when members of the clergy team can discuss and debate current practices in the Church. My hope is to help us engage in a dialogue where contrary opinions can be helpful in our understanding and our practices. Our current culture tends to polarize issues and debates into right and wrong.

I am convinced that the working relationship of our clergy team can be an example of how we don't have to agree in order to be faithful and effective. As we face the questions of today and the debates of tomorrow, let us be reminded that we are stronger when we engage each other in open and honest dialogue. Together, we can find pathways forward that we have not seen on our own.



Dear Minister:

As you prepare the upcoming Federal budget, I would encourage you and your Cabinet colleagues to place a high priority on the needs of the least amongst us.

The Anglican Church of Canada that adopted **Compassion, Justice, and Reason** as its banner during the last Federal election is committed to continue partnering with you and other levels of government in ensuring that Canada lives up to its potential as a caring and compassionate country, especially as we celebrate 150 years of Confederation.

The competition for funding is undoubtedly fierce. However, social spending should be seen as an investment in the quality of life for all Canadians. 
When they're on the phone and just out of reach, I'll get into things like sugar and bleach. Oh, they'll snap their fingers and then shake their head,


